Hindu Wife and Hindu Nation Gender, Religion and the Prehistory of Indian Nationalism

Author: Tanika Sarkar

In her new book Tanika Sarkar discusses the Hindu ideas and traditions that have shaped hegemonic and dominant conceptions of Indian 'womanhood', 'domesticity', 'wifeliness', 'mothering' and India as a 'Hindu' nation. She also examines literary and social traditions, elite voices and popular culture, the rhetoric and the

ground realities which have shaped the lived reality of modern India. Scandalliterature, rumours, and the popular press are scrutinised for other examples at the subaltern level of these same ideas. She concludes with a detailed examination of how earlier Indian religious traditions of 'saintliness', 'sacrifice', 'heroism', and 'warfare' are being subverted or transformed by militant and fundamentalist forms of contemporary Hinduism. In sum, Hindu Wife and Hindu Nation comprises an innovative historicisation, and a scathing critique, of many of the dominant concepts by which some Indians, and specifically those of Hindu north India, think and live today.

Tanika Sarkar is Professor, Centre for Historical Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University, Delhi. Her earlier books include Bengal 1928-1934: The Politics of Popular Protest.

WOMEN IN THE NEW ASIA From Pain to Power

Author: Yayori Matsui

This remarkable and lively book charts the effects of the economic boom on women across Asia. The author, one of Japan's leading journalists, demonstrates how Asian women are confronting rapid economic development accompanied by widespread infringement of their human rights. Analysing the lives of women in Japan, Thailand, the Philippines, Taiwan, China, Nepal and Korea, Yayori Matsui explores issues such as globalization, the feminization of migration, sexual violence and prostitution, and development projects as the cause of mass deforestation and displacement of entire communities.

However she also presents women's positive political reaction to the onslaught: credit co-ops, democratization movements and unionization of women workers. She meets women who have organized anti-logging blockades, literacy classes and campaigns against trafficking. She finds women across Asia resisting the dictatorship of development, the feminization of poverty and patriarchal values. Throughout the continent, she finds the seeds of hope for a new Asia.

Yayori Matsui was for over thirty years a journalist on ASAHI SHIMBUN, one of Japan's leading newspapers. She is a founder of the Asia-Japan Women's Resource Center and edits a journal - 'Women's 21st Century'.
