It achieves this through the establishment of a World Wide Web (WWW) site with a custom 'multivalent' exploration engine, a multimedia repository and an open-ended framework to attach classification schemes, 3D interactive models, advanced visualisation, specialised user-interface and for the development of software tools for managing and compiling design cases and for building interactive 3D models.
