The Atlas of Languages of Intercultural Communication in the Pacific, Asia, and the Americas constitutes a major comprehensive contribution to knowledge in the field. Much of its content is based on recent research results in a large number of fields such as contact languages; lingue franche; active and passive bi- and multilingualism resorted to in communication situations; the origins, roles and functions of pidgin languages and various aspects of communication across linguistic boundaries in more than two-thirds of the world.

It far-reaching expansion of our represents а knowledae of the historical development and the present state of intercultural communication in this vast area. For instance, detailed information on some hitherto almost hybrid languages which originated in past communication situations in unknown Central Asian and China is presented in the Atlas to readers outside the specific areas for the first time. The diverse roles, functions and influcence of the large colonial languages in the Pacific, parts of Asia, and the Americas are demonstrated in detail, as well as those

of missionary and church languages in several areas.

The Atlas is a detailed, far-reaching handbook of fundamental importance, dealing with a large number of diverse fields of knowledge, with the reported facts based on sound scholarly research and scientific findings, but presented in a form intelligible to non-specialists and educated lay persons in general.

More than eighty leading experts from different parts of the world have contributed to the Atlas. The multi-facetted information is presented in 138 texts and on 151 high quality coloured map sheets which contain 299 individual maps. This milestone publication is a handbook of great importance and value to linguists, socio-linguists, sociologists, anthropologists, human geographers, political scientists, communication specialists, governmental and administrative agencies,

and international organizations. An amount of the information contained in the work will also be of great interest to agencies and persons concerned with human rights.
