The folktales were originally published in Tok Pisin, the pidgin English language of Papua New Guinea. The two-volume collection presents the complete set of 1047 folktales that were originally published from 1972 through 1997 in Tok Pisin. This collection is one of the largest general collections of Papua New Guinean folktales; all of Papua new Guinea's province are represented and approximately 35% of Papua New Guinea's 700 language/culture groups are represented. This first volume presents the introduction and 550 folktales; the second volume presents the remaining folktales.

The folktales have been intensively indexed in the volumes and the indices are presented in volume two. Indices are given for author, village, original language (or culture group), province, flora and fauna, and folklore motif. Also in volume two are a glossary, a set of maps and a gazetteer.]
