In Bangladesh the law is far more involved with "Stranger" violence against women, for example, murder, rape or trafficking. Thus, the problem for women, who wish to take legal action against abusive husbands, is that cases of wife abuse often are inadequately dealt with by members of the professional community such as the policy, lawyers and the judiciary. In the absence of specific laws, cases of wife abuse are often filed under

inappropriate legal provisions (e.g. as dowry offences). This happens of the police are often ignorant of the issue as a public crime and do not know under which law it should be field.

Bangladesh National Women Lawyers' Association (BNWLA) conducted a year long survey among victims of wife abuse and its implications. The book, therefore, appeals for urgent reforms in laws pertaining to violence against women to include wife abuse as a punishable offence.
