[This book is based on the findings of two distinct studies conducted over a sixteenmonth period in two locations of Nepal. The first study, employing traditional ethno science methods, explores illness beliefs and practices in rural Gorkha District of central Nepal. The findings suggest an emerging cultural model of HIV/AIDS that is based on an integration of

- 1) indigenous concepts (placing HIV/AIDS into a existing illness classification paradigm)
- 2) Western based HIV/AIDS prevention education messages, and
- 3) Public discourse of HIV / AIDS.

The Second study, based on the linguistic analysis of thirty texts collected from persons with AIDS living in the capital city of kathmandu, illuminates emotional and contextual aspects of the contested cultural models. It also discriminates between meanings of HIV/AIDS shared by those who suffer with it and members of the wider culture. Both studies are used to examine the cultural contexts and underlying schemata which are involved in the construction of cultural models of HIV/AIDS in Nepal.

This book represents the first long – term field study of the cultural dimensions of HIV/AIDS in south Asia. It is also one of the few ethnographies of HIV/AIDs to emphasize the depth and diversity of the people's view and construction of the emerging illness. And it is the only HIV/AIDs ethnography to utilize a discourse analysis approach.

Although this book is written primarily for scholars of Nepal, other scholars such as anthropologists, social epidemiologists and public health professionals would also enjoy the topics covered. It may also be of theoretical and methodological interest more widely to cognitive anthropologists because it explores the relationship between cognitive schemata and the creation of cultural models of meaning and provides a better understanding of how people incorporate new ideas into established cognitive systems. Cognitive linguists would also be interested because

the successful use of the narrative analysis method provides cross-linguistic validity to the discourse analysis models, a relatively new model of linguistic research.]

[The Jirel People inhabit the Jiri Valley, in the Dolakha District of eastern Nepal. Jirel culture features many elements that set it apart from the cultures of other Nepali ethnic groups. The Jirels practice a form of Buddhism that varies significantly from the Buddhist practices of their Sherpa neighbors. They also venerate Hindu gods and celebrate all the Hindu rituals with great enthusiasm. Additionally, each Jirel clean has its own god or goddesses, neither Buddhist nor Hindu; and these clans also engage in ancestor spirit worship. The Jirels Practice their own form of shamanism, centered on practitioners known as Phombos.

It is because of this mixture of diverse cultural elements in Jirel culture, Hindu, Buddhist and Shamanistic, that we have chosen to call this book Halfway to the Mountains. The title is intended to emphasize the extraordinary syncretic nature of Jirel sociocultural and religious traditions, being symbolically and figuratively located halfway between the lowlands, from whence emanates Hindu cultural influences, and the lofty mountains, the abodes of the ancient god and also from where Buddhism spread to this part of Nepal.]
