[Decentralisation and deconcentration are part of the Royal Government of Cambodia's reforms to promote democracy, improve development opportunities, reduce poverty and ensure sustainable development.

The RGC is undertaking decentralisation reforms to devolve power to semi-autonomous (Commune Councils are described here as semi-autonomous due to the fact that there is substantial control from the governmental hierarchy that lies above them.) elected governments at the Commune and Sangkat (urban commune) level, and to move towards enhanced roles for provinces and municipalities as deconcentrated entities of the centre. In March of 2001 the RGC embarked on a bold experiment in decentralisation of the government, with the enactment of the Law on Administration and Management of the Communes and Sangkats, and the Commune Election Law, followed by elections of Commune Councils in February of 2002. A range of functions, spending authorities, and resources have been devolved to local governments and the provincial governors have been given responsibilities of support to and supervision of Commune/Sangkar Councils. In support of this effort, a large body of rules and regulations has been passed in a relatively short period of time. How these rules and regulations fit together with each other and already existing legislation, plus how the ongoing government efforts towards decentralization fit within these structures, are the focus of this report. Several primary observations can be made as a result of analyzing the current situation in Cambodia.]

[This study examines the evolution of mechanisms for conflict management since 1998, and their effectiveness in preventing conflict escalation during the general elections of 2003. The study draws on extensive field research carried out by CDRI researchers on the 1998 and 2003 Elections, and on the practical experience of conflict management gained by staff of CDRI's Center For Peace and Development which, through its Committee for Conflict Prevention in Cambodian Elections, hosted

a four year programme of meetings between election organizers and representatives of political and civil society.

The present study looked in detail at three specific development relevant to conflict management that look place between 1998 to 2003, namely the reform of government institutions involved in electoral conflict management, particularly the NEC and the commune level of government; the development of civil society programmes for conflict management; and the changes in elections, the complaints procedure, and the voter registration procedures. Fieldwork was conducted during the 2003 election conflict at national and local level. Ability to manage conflict management effectively is regarded in this study as a function of the technical capacity and political legitimacy of institutions, and level of trust and goodwill between political actors. It is also noted that effective conflict management can itself improve the political legitimacy if institutions and the level of trust between political actors.]
