[This book analyses four development projects carried out in a Hmong community in Namon Neua village - the author's home village where he grew up and finished primary school - in rural Laos. It is about 'how' rather than 'what' the projects create, and their impacts on the local environment and livelihoods.

Lilao explains how a development approach that focuses solely o technical or economic aspects will definitely bring about a different result from a project that also considers social and environmental consequences. For example, there are more problems in an irrigation project if destruction of fisheries and salinity of the area are "not considered" or if a road built for better access to local markets ends up encroaching into ethnic burial grounds or commons used by the local community.

The term "integrated sustainable livelihoods" is used to refer to the development approach that encompasses activities aimed at improving the well-being of rural people. Rural development is achieved in a manner that is locally acceptable, dignified, as well as socially and environmentally sustainable. This approach takes into account, in all phases of a project lifecycle, socio-economic, cultural, environmental, and institutional aspects. Local participation and consultation in the decision-making and management processes are fundamental elements of rural development.

This book will benefit to state planners, aid agencies and donors, development practitioners, scholars and researchers as well as others concerned about development, environment, and resource management issues in Laos and the countries of the Mekong region.]

[Post-war Laos is a thorough and original study of the difficult making of a multi-ethnic nation. Combining a historical approach and a multi-sited ethnography, it provides unique insights into the ideology of ethnicity in Laos. This book is clearly a major contribution to the understanding of one of the less known countries in Asia.

Vatthana Pholsena examines how the Lao Marxist regime has attempted to construct a legitimizing nationalist discourse by imposing its own cultural preferences, view of history, and ethnic classification. Dr Pholsena's approach is ethnographic, based on fieldwork in Laos, and historical. Her theoretically sophisticated analysis draws on a wide range of contemporary theory on nationalism, ethnicity and identity to point out the contradictions and paradoxes inherent in the multiple identities that ethnic minority people in Laos have been forced to adopt.

This book gives an intimate glimpse into the day-to-day lives of the monks, novices and nuns of Wat Sok Pa Luang. Who are these boys, men and women and why did they become a novice or why did they ordain? Although the focus is on the mundane, the significance of Buddhism in their lives shines through.

The temple complex Wat Sok Pa Luang is blanketed in a peaceful and contemplative atmosphere. The rustle of leaves in trees and bushes, the sounds of the sweeping rhythm of the broom, and the daily chants nestle down over the whole terrain. But within this serene world other layers are revealed: desires for love and sport, family problems, malaria, poverty and education perils. At the Buddhist high school for example, they share the classroom with seventy other novices. The school has far too many students and on one occasion the floor of a classroom came down. But the students have no choice. Most of them became a novice because their parents had no money for education. Laos is a country which until recently was largely isolated from the rest of the world; its economy is small-scale and predominantly agricultural.

Despite the extremely sober life style, as documented in this book, the stories of the novices and monks are often heart-warming.]
