[Unlike counterfeits, parallel imports are genuine goods but imported and distributed by unauthorized traders. The Legal question is whether intellectual property right laws should also prohibit the sale of such goods. In common law, the legal treatment varies greatly not only across jurisdictions, but also within the same jurisdiction and even for the same type of intellectual property. Applying an industrial economic approach, we argue that if investment by the authorized distributors is insignificant, parallel importing can indeed undermine the investment incentive of the authorized distributor. In such cases, a trade – off exists, since banning parallel imports although increases investment, has the undersirable effect of lessening competition, which harms consumers. This paper shows that up until the 1970s, both countries shared the view that the goals of social policy were best pursued through economic policy i.e. 'growth substituted for welfare'. The 1970s witnessed a divergence. In Australia it was asserted that in an affluent society growth was not enough and that the goals of poverty eradication and equity demanded a more active welfare policy. In Singapore such an enthusiasm for welfare appeared unaffordable. Nevertheless Singapore maintained major government commitments in areas of social spending such as education and housing although these were seen as 'economic' as much as 'welfare' investments. The paper reflects on the implications of these historical similarities and differences for current understandings of the role of social policy.]
