The strong presence and veneration of this male deity on the island, and the innovative styles of religiosity now associated with him, justify calling muneeswaran a 'new god' in the Indian diaspora.

In examining Muneeswaran, Vineeta Sinha documents a neglected aspect of local Hinduism and the ritual domain surrounding guardian deities (kaaval deivam). She also considers a broader question, asking why this deity, brought from Tamilnady to Malaya more than 170 years ago, has developed a powerful appeal for young Singaporean Hindus three and four generations removed from their Indian origins. Her discussion of these issues provides an ethnographic documentation of urban-based Hindu religiosity in contemporary Singapore, and makes an important contribution to the global study of diasporic religious experience.]

There are no sacred texts, nor canons, nor dogmas in tang-ki worship. Margaret Chan's seminal investigation into tang-ki worship reveals aspects of it that hitherto have never been recorded. These include the drama and history of tang-ki worship; the costumes, make-up and props used in performance; the religious significance of tang-ki rituals; the notion of tang-ki training; and the performance scripts used by tang-kis. The social dynamics of tang-ki worship as communal theatre are also discussed and a provocative hypothesis as to the religious nature of traditional Chinese theatre forms is argued. It is held that the very act of theatre, the taking on of an image by an actor, is a transmogrifying ritual where a mortal transforms into a aod.

The book richly documents the history and ritual background to spirit mediumship, but also its dramaturgical dimension, including music, movement, costumes, makeup, weapons, props and training. This book will be of interest to the general reader and the specialist alike.'

[Living Colours, featuring 21 artists and nearly 100 works of art, many of which have never been seen in public previously, is published in conjunction with the donation of the Times Collection to the National Heritage Board.

The Times Collection was conceived in the years shortly after Singapore's independence in 1965 and enjoys a strong representation of art pieces produced in the 1970s to 1980s by some of the leading artists in Singapore. One unusual aspect of the collection was that a significant number of works were specially commissioned.

The rationale for the selection of works and the brief to the artists was to capture the rapidly changing landscape of a developing Singapore-selecting what were to them, vanishing trades, landmarks or scenes, locations that were marked with shared memories, or communities that appeared under threat of disappearing with urban development. The result were works full of the colour, character and flux of the 1970s. They not only capture the geographic or location specificities of that time (Which include buildings, roads and sites that have changed beyond immediate recognition), but also the spirit and sensibilities of that time.

Within this publication, the works are organised in three themes. The first looks at shared and lived experiences and mark a moment in time. The Second grouping showcases works that have engaged tradition in media and materials. Last but not least, the third group presents paintings that follow the artistic expressions and trends of the times.

For those of us who have lived through the 1970s, this book is a collector's item, capturing images of bygone days and unleashing an abundance of memories – scenes of [portable cinemas, meat markets, alley hawkers and flea markets that have been mostly phased out of our cultural and lived landscape within a generation. This is the perfect keepsake to preserve the memories of yesteryear.]
