A historical analysis is also included in each chapter, but the emphasis is on the current workable and future potential of social care in Asia.

The main aim of this book is to stress that achieving economic objectives must go in tandem with meeting social objectives. The pursuit of one at the expense of other can, in the long term, lead to poor development and major societal setbacks. By maintaining a good balance between economic and social objectives, policy makers can successfully achieve greater overall societal growth.]
