Rather than become a schoolteacher like his siblings, he accepted the position and packed his bags for the long journey east. He could not foresee the tumultuous days that lay ahead. As world war II engulfed Malays, most of the European community fled the country, were captured or perished at the hands of the Japanese invaders. Maurice Cotterill was one of the very few British civilians who stayed behind, were not captured, and survived.

Cotterill took to the jungle. There he spent the rest of the war in the company of guerrillas of Chinese descent whose priorities were to rid the country first of the Japanese and then of the British; the bonds he formed with them enabled him to live through appalling conditions with little in the way of food, arms or ammunition. Based in part on a diary left by Cotterill, the book offers vivid insights on Malaya as it experienced political volatility and change. It sets the occupation period in the context of the time, as World War II was followed first by the British Military Administration and then by the Communist emergency.

The book is both a gripping chronicle of survival, and a document of Malaysia's history in a period of chaos and deprivation, as it moved gradually towards independence in 1957, and the dawn of a new era.
