All the inscriptions are translated and re-interpreted; all narrative reliefs are decoded and explained. The way the Chams perceived the Khmers of that period is explored through Cham inscriptions. The resulting data of the various disciplines is integrated into a new updated vision of the art, religion and social structure Cambodia under the rule of Jayavarman VII.

The most surprising and intimate stories of the gods and human figures of the great epics of the Mahabharata, Ramayana and the Puranas are brought to life in much more detail than in the previous work on Khmer Mythology. A new emphasis is given to Buddhist visual narrative on the life of the Buddha and on the Jatakas. In addition, the lives of unusual animal and humanoid creatures at the edges between myth and fantasy, is explored and amply illustrated.

The book also examines the spreading of Khmer visual narrative in Thailand and Laos, from the VII to the XIV centuries.

Thai Furniture discusses the evolution of religious furniture such as the elaborate gilded lacquerware cupboards for storing manuscripts and monksÕ prayer seats used during the Ayutthaya period, the carved and gilded court furniture of the Rattanakosin period and simpler everyday items such as chests, tables and beds found in many private homes.

This volume will survey the rich heritage of Thai Buddhist paintings on cloth and on wood and will be lavishly illustrated. It will draw on the two finest surviving collections of these traditional Thai paintings. The first collection is that of the Thai Fine Arts Department, preserved in the Thai national museums and the National Gallery, and the second is the collection formed in the 1960s by the American heiress Doris Duke. The extensive Duke collection was assembled after Miss Duke visited Thailand and decided to build a world-class collection of Thai art. The finest of her Thai paintings have been divided between two major American museums, the Asian Art Museum of San Francisco, and the Walters Art Museum in Baltimore.

The fragility of Thai Buddhist paintings on cloth and wood has meant that very few examples survive from before the early nineteenth century, but their history can be sketched from some of these rare survivals. From the middle Bangkok period (1820-1920) the rich holdings of some two hundred examples from the two collections will be extensively reproduced and studied in this volume. The joint authors are Prathum Chumpengbhandhu, formerly curator of the Fine Arts Department in Bangkok and Dr. Henry Ginsburg, curator of Thai manuscripts and books at The British Library in London. Dr. GinsburgÕs previous two volumes have explored some fine surviving examples of Thai painting in old manuscripts

During the past few decades of the twentieth century archaeological, historical, epigraphic, linguistic, and art historical research opened windows on Thailand's ancient pre-Tai era (third millennium BC to thirteenth century AD) that previously had been closed. These extraordinary glimpses into Thailand's once hidden past have remained somewhat independent one from the other, however, and provide only a partial picture of the three and half millennia that led towards the formation of the modern Thai nation.

Since written sources that shed light on Thailand's earliest years are few and far between, art objects are an important means of illuminating not only the country's artistic traditions but also the religious, political, and ethnic millieu in which Thai art took root and flourished. This richly illustrated, very readable book presents a survey of early Thai art within the context of recent art historical and related research. The myriad pieces of the complex cross-cultural jigsaw puzzle are fitted together, and where gaps remain, the isolated dots are connected to draw a coherent picure of Thai protohistory and its art. The manner in which the ancient past evolved into Thailand's historical period emerges.

Lacquerware originated in China over 3,000 years and quickly spread to Korea, Japan, Burma and Thailand. It is not certain when it arrived in the kingdom of Lan Na, today's northern Thailand, but by the 16th century Burmese records were already commenting on the skill of Lan Na lacquer makers.

Following the attack on Chiang Mai by King Burengnong in 1557, the rulers of that principality sent tribute goods including lacquerware to Burma. Lacquer making reached its apogee during the reign of King Kawila of Chiang Mai when the king also brought expert craftsmen from Chiang Tung. Their skills were combined with local

workshops to create new designs and regional differences developed in centres such as San Kampaeng, Phrae, Nan, Uttaradit and Lampang.

This book by an expert on Lan Na arts and crafts, unravels the complex strands underlying Lan Na lacquerware and enables the reader to compare and contrast these beautiful artefacts with better-known examples from Burma.

It is both a critique of an important element of Thailand's border defence regime and an introduction to the complex political geography and human security issues in the borderlands.]
