Commencing there Weber takes the reader on a fascinating and colourful journey of discovery of a commodity that many may take for granted, but few fully understand.

For much of his long and scholarly career as a historian, Prince Damrong was intrigued by the life of Naresuan. This northern prince led the Thai armed forces during a turbulent period in the late sixteenth century, succeeded to the throne of Ayutthaya and is portrayed as the greatest of Thai kings. The author begins the biography with a brief description of his subject's family and then turns to the first but unsuccessful Burmese attempt to conquer the kingdom in 1949. He continues quickly through the second and third invasions from Burma in the 1960s, which brought the Thai under Burmese control. The greater part of the book concentrates on the hard-fought restoration of independence, beginning in the mid-1580s, and the ensuing struggle to secure the kingdom against further foreign aggression.
