Art and Architecture of Central India under the Kachchhapaghatas: A Case Study of Sihonia / Arvind Kumar Singh

Local history and archaeology is vital to appreciate the land and its people, cultural evolution in the area, discovery and utilization of natural resources, religious activities, art and architecture, etc. as well as to understand the profile of the region and the country. Central India is very rich in terms of art and architecture and its uniform and diverse features, innovation and continuity of forms, and so on. Three families of the Kachchhapaghatas ruled over the northern part of Central India. Of them, the Sihonia-Gwalior branch ruled for a longer period of time (ninth to twelfth century) and built a number of monuments at different places. Remains of their temples and sculptures reveal some unique features like, the bhadra niches of the Kakanamatha temple which take the form of miniature doors with ribbed awnings and phamsana-style pediments in accordance with ninth century conventions, the devices like kuta which, with more intricately worked mesh-pattern, pillar with festoons, and attached figures, appear to be the characteristic features of the Gopadri region, the extreme side of the panel depicting figures of different types of vyalas, which is a typical feature of the Kachchhapaghata style, and so on. Scholars of historical and cultural studies admit that the study of religious landscape needs to be attempted at a large scale if the rich heritage of our country is to be projected in its totality. Sihonia, the ancient capital city of the Kachchhapaghatas, forms the nucleus of such a sacred landscape as there are remains of more than a dozen temples belonging to different religious beliefs, which cross multiple cultural boundaries, both in time and space, and thus has great potential for a meaningful study of the culture of the Gopadri region in particular, and of Central India in general.

"Noticing the monk's enthusiasm, Bose encouraged him to try his hand at painting. Now, drawing upon his imagination for subjects, Manjusri began to paint. Bose was surprised at his talent, seeing in his pictures an association with the works of artists of the modern schools of painting in the West.

On vacation in Ceylon in 1934, Manjusri put his newly developed artistic ability to test. He began to make copies of temple murals, first at the Sunandarama Vihara at Ambalangoda where he had seen and been impressed by a painting of dancing figures. Living in the temple compound, he spent twenty-one days tracing the painting, recording details and making careful notes of broken or destroyed portions, and he took another month reproducing the work in color. He returned to Santiniketan with copies of seven murals. Tagore, who had taken up painting at the age of sixty eight, was having an exhibition of his work at the school. Seeing Manjusri's copies he insisted that one side of the exhibition room be reserved to display these temple murals. The reproductions of the temple paintings caused a sensation at Santiniketan, revealing a previously unknown treasure trove of Sri Lankan religious art. Although historians were aware of the 5th century Sinhalese wall paintings at Sigiriya, which were roughly contemporary with the period of the great cave paintings of Ajanta, little if anything was known of the Sri Lankan temple murals created during the period of Buddhist revival in the 18th and 19th centuries. These paintings, appreciated locally more for their moral and religious teachings than for their artistic merit, were crumbling away due to neglect and decay, or were being over painted by zealous benefactors who wished to modify temple interiors. The 18th and 19th century murals represented a continuation of the traditions of Buddhist art started under royal patronage by trained artists in earlier centuries. They had been executed by rural artists who interpreted the stories of the life of the Buddha and the Jataka tales that depicted events in his previous births, with accretions of contemporary life and folk traditions. Harry Pieris, the Ceylonese Director of the Tagore School of Art, became interested in Manjusri's copies, both as works of art and as priceless replicas of a vanishing tradition of religious art. The work of the 19th century Hungarian artist August Schoefft (1809-1888) might have been forgotten, had the last Sikh Maharaja Duleep Singh not bought

a collection of eleven of his paintings from him in 1863.

These paintings of Mughal and Sikh subjects and scenes were the product of a trip made by Schoefft to India from 1838 to 1842. During it, Schoefft travelled from Calcutta (Kolkata), through Delhi where he portrayed the last Mughal emperor Bahadur Shah Zafar and his two sons, to the Sikh kingdom of the Punjab where he was hosted by the genial anglophile Maharaja Sher Singh. The spectacular core of this collection is Schoefft's Court of Lahore panorama. It contains almost sixty identifiable characters who collectively contributed to the fabled splendor of the Sikh Darbar before its collapse in 1849.

The collection was ultimately inherited by Duleep Singh's grand-daughter Princess Bamba Sutherland who died in Lahore in 1957. Her legatee sold the paintings and other Sikh artefacts to the Pakistan government in 1961.

Over March - June 2021, Schoefft's paintings have been expertly restored by a

team of five Hungarian specialists made available by the Hungarian Government. It seemed opportune therefore for F.S. Aijazuddin's book Sikh Portraits by European Artists (1979) - a seminal work on Schoefft's work in the Princess Bamba collection - to be updated and reissued to commemorate Schoefft's visit to the Punjab 180 years ago.

This volume is a tribute to the under-appreciated talent of the Hungarian master artist August Schoefft. His 19th century compatriot and host in the Punjab Dr. Martin Honigberger said of him: 'He has a high reputation all over the peninsula and it gives great credit to our own country to give such men to the world'.

This book surveys the work done by European artists who visited the Punjab, Sindh and Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa between 1845 and 1906, and the royal visits by three British Heirs apparent between 1875 and 1906, and unusually the Russian Czarevitch to Lahore in 1891.

The book includes two groups. The first, works by six artists: Charles Hardinge who fought in the first Anglo-Sikh war of 1845-46; Prince Waldemar of Prussia, who came to India to sight-see and instead fought as a combatant on the side of the British forces against the Sikhs at the three battles of Mudki, Ferozeshah and Sobraon; Dr Henry A. Oldfield came to the Punjab as part of the British force that occupied it after the unequal treaty of 1846; Colonel A.F.P Harcourt who served in Multan and Lahore in the late 1870s; the prolific war-correspondent / illustrator William Simpson; and the American artist, Edwin Lord Weeks.

The second group are four royal visitors: the British Prince Albert Edward of Wales who visited in 1876; his eldest son Prince Albert Victor who toured in 1890; and Prince George and Princess Mary of Wales in 1906. The fourth royal visitor was a Russian Romanov - the Czarevitch Nicholas Alexandrovitch (later the ill-fated Czar Nicholas II) who came to Lahore in January 1891

It is hoped that this book will be helpful in analyzing the imagery in Sadequain's drawings and establishing the links to appropriate historical and cultural context. Its empirical research and textual contents are balanced to address the sensitivities that attempt to compare and contrast arbitrary and loaded concepts.

The much anticipated revelation of works by artists Ghada Amer and Reza Farkhondeh promises to be a visual adventure of all things peculiar and familiar. Amer and Farkhondeh who are of Egyptian and Iranian origin respectively have been working together since 2001 on series of works charged with romantic overtones, expressionistic tendencies and sometimes relaying socio-political critique. Sharing similar backgrounds both received formal art training in France and now live in New York. Amer is regarded as "one of the most important contemporary feminist artists today", while Farkhondeh is best known for his explorations on the traditional theme of landscapes. The meeting of these two artistic horizons took itself to another territory at the Singapore Tyler Print Institute.

By incorporating various printing techniques, drawing, painting and embroidery; these 48 unique works and 17 edition prints conjure up the imagery of fairytales and provocative silhouettes half concealed between intricate layers of printed flora. The works reveal themselves in a confluence of Eastern and Western cultural symbols and associations – showcasing Arabic script framed by images of Wonder Woman and instances of stencilled cartoon characters and Hindu gods. Amer's rendition of suggestive figures in hypnotic repetition of psychedelic hues, takes on the task of questioning myths, pop culture references and objectification of women. While Farkhondeh's application of printed flora, birds and pale washes obscure these underlying erotic forms and gestures. These richly textured works juxtaposing two very different artistic styles blur conventional geographic, national, and artistic landmarks. Thus surprising viewers with its uniqueness and destabilising our accustomed preconceptions.

destabilising our accustomed preconceptions. This also marks the first, two artists' collaboration for STPI, expanding the creative dialogue between the studio and workshop. "This is our very first experience working with two artists at the same time. The collaboration is double the challenge and complexity, but it provided a huge creative source which produced incredible results", says Director of STPI, Irene Lee. STPI's paper- and printmakers find themselves responding to the challenges by adapting techniques to the imperatives of this dynamic duo, in an effort to push the limits of art and of artistic material.

The Lines Fall Where They May is an exhibition on mark-making and the delicate, faint signs of nonhuman life and environments. It centres on two recent bodies of print works created at STPI's workshop – the Edibles series of sap-drenched pressings by Berlin- and Seoul-based artist Haegue Yang, a continuation of her previous engagement at STPI with perishable plant-based foods; and copper- and ink-embossed paper works by Indian artist Prabhavathi Meppayil, who completed six sets of geometries (each comprising eight individual prints), three sets of which are exhibited. The Lines Fall Where They May also features the works of six other artists: Ghada Amer & Reza Farkhondeh, Genevieve Chua, Amanda Heng, Lin Tianmiao and Suzann Victor, most of which were created during their residency with STPI.

Mark-making is often thought of as visual aggregations of colour, shape, texture and scale, subject to the tightening and release of the artist's control. Alternatively, they are expressions of the artist's psychic, emotional or relational life, as portals through which we discover the artist's subjectivity and agency. In other words, marks are the indices of various narratives that the artist expresses or allows. These marks exist as lines, blotches, indentations, brushstrokes, etchings, notches, tears, edges, and others in a near-inexhaustible list of possibilities for artistic production, with the artist as the fulcrum of activity. The Lines Fall Where They May suggests that marks form the ways in which the artist is ever so slightly decentred, and marks are the small signs of life left by others. These marks are openings through which stories other than the artist's own are known; they are how nonhuman systems and environments make themselves felt, whether those worlds are cybernetic, vegetal, mineral or animal. These signs are barely there, but sometimes in the barely-there exists enough consideration and measure of worlds apart from our own.

By scrutinising the information from multiple entry points, the artist begins to "see" the invisible space, a construction of "nothingness" within an endless project for renewal.
